## The Parish Hall

St Mary's Hall on the Main Highway, below the Harp of Erin junction, opened with a great flourish over the Easter weekend of 1934. At the official opening and blessing, not only Church dignitaries attended but also the local MP and the Chairman of the Ellerslie Roads Board. A Grand Ball followed on the Monday.

Halls belonging to a local Church were frequently the only venue available for wedding receptions, concerts, card evenings, pictures, 1934 was the height of the etc. depression and it took great future confidence the in by Monsignor Lane, Parish Priest at the time, to bring the building of the hall to a successful conclusion.
