What is essential is invisible

"Unless I see it and touch it, I will not believe it," said Thomas. This statement reflects a rational and logical approach that is prevalent in today's society. It suggests that everything can be rationally explained and that any obscurity can be illuminated by scientific inquiry.



Of course, we must be guided by reason, but we must also listen to the imagination and the heart. There are aspects of life that cannot be understood by purely rational means.

Science is not everything. To adopt Thomas' approach would be to condemn ourselves to living in a purely material world. But some of the most important ingredients of life can neither be seen nor touched. There is a layer of reality that eludes the senses but is, nevertheless, absolutely real. The visible world is only part of a greater world that includes invisible realities from which it draws its chief significance.

Seeing and hearing can be crutches that prevent us from thinking, feeling, and imagining. Often, the handicapped have more feeling and more perception than the so-called normal. Vision, insight, understanding, and perception have little to do with seeing. Many people prefer facts to vision. When a person knows something, really knows it, deep down in their heart, they don't have to argue about it or prove it. They just know it, and that's enough. We are no longer sufficiently aware of the importance of what we cannot know intellectually and which we must know in other ways.

Nevertheless, we can sympathize with Thomas. He was merely echoing the human cry for certainty. However, here on Earth, there is no absolute certainty about God and spiritual realities. We have to be content with "seeing a dim reflection in a mirror." We are not looking through an open door but peering through a chink. This chink is big enough to let the light in but not so big as to eliminate the wonder and the mystery. Too much light or too little light, and we are blind.

Rationalists approach God and religion as something that can be understood and explained; mystics approach God as something mysterious that can neither be understood nor explained but only experienced. Faith takes us where our senses cannot go. But which is stronger: faith without doubts or faith that contends with doubt?

Divine Mercy Sunday

Today is a special day, that serves as a profound occasion for reflection upon the boundless compassion and forgiveness bestowed by God. The origins of this observance can be traced back to the revelations received by St. Faustina Kowalska, who conveyed messages from Jesus regarding His Divine Mercy.

On this day, Catholic adherents engage in special masses, venerate the Divine Mercy image, and partake in the sacrament of reconciliation. It stands as a day of profound hope and spiritual renewal, offering solace and comfort to those seeking God's mercy.

Gospel: Jn 20:19-31: When he touched the wounds of the risen Jesus, Thomas' doubt was turned into faith.
