Working with love

Two people can be doing the exact same work, even working side by side, and yet bring contrasting attitudes to it. One loves his work and has made a total gift of himself to it. He takes pride in what he's doing and puts a part of his soul into it. The other hates his work and is at best only half-hearted. For him, it's only a job. The only thing that concerns him is the pay check.

Jesus gives us a good example of this in his parable of the hired hand and the good shepherd. What a contrast there is between them! For the hired hand, minding the sheep is just a job. He's in it only for the wages. He doesn't know the sheep or care about them. The sheep suffer as a result.

For the good shepherd, minding the sheep is not just a job. It is a way of life, a vocation. He knows his sheep and cares about them to the point that he is prepared to risk his life to save them. The sheep thrive as a result. What makes the good shepherd so different from the contractor is that he loves his work. He is interested in it and dedicated to it.

This doesn't make it any easier. If anything, it makes it harder because he does it more thoroughly. But it enables him to bring all his energies to it. If you love what you do, the energy will be given to you. Not only does the work benefit, but the worker benefits too - it brings out the best in one. To work like this is to be free.

Most of us are contractors in the sense that we do not work for ourselves. But that doesn't mean that we have to have the mentality of a contractor. Just because a person demands adequate remuneration for his work doesn't mean that he is the kind of contractor Jesus was talking about. He doesn't have to bring the attitude of the contractor to his work. He doesn't have to do it just for the pay. He can still bring the attitude of the good shepherd to his work. We have a right to a decent wage. Apart from other considerations, it is good for one's dignity.

But as Christians, we ought to try to see our work, whatever it happens to be, as a service to others. If we do, then we are being good shepherds. We have left the ranks of the contractors. We are members of a sacred band—those who perform needful but irksome tasks in a spirit of service. Honest toil makes a person's bread taste sweet. The contractor works under the severest handicap of all—his heart is not in his work. It is possible to go through one's entire life with the mentality of a contractor. The loss hardly bears thinking about. Something corrosive happens to the soul of those who stop caring about the quality of their work and are just going through the motions.
