Jesus begins to find himself

At 12 years old, Jesus accompanied Mary and Joseph to Jerusalem for the Passover, marking the time for him to take on the obligations of the Law. Parents gradually introduce their children to the community and its traditions, but on the return journey, Jesus was left behind in the city. Though it was a serious situation, it was the result of a misunderstanding, showing that even in the best families, mistakes happen. Mary and Joseph searched frantically, questioning why Jesus caused them such anxiety. The true test of good parenting is love, especially in difficult times.



Jesus wasn't lost—he was in the house of God, having an adventure. When found, he told his parents he must be about his Father's business. Though they didn't fully understand, Mary pondered his words. Listening is key to parenting, and this experience brought the family closer together.

Jesus obeyed them, and they realized how special he was, even as he began to grow away from them. Parents must learn that children grow to be their own persons, and possessiveness can hinder true love.

Jesus' journey of self-discovery in the Temple is an example for us all to find our true identity as children of God. Just as Jesus grew in the context of family, so does our own growth.
